in their learning in addition to their usual ongoing teaching, planning and meetings. It has been exciting to see the progress students have made despite our challenging year.

**Crazy hair and colourful sock day** was a fun day with spectacular and imaginative hair styles and brightly coloured socks. Thank you to families for supporting fundraising for cystic fibrosis and the P&C. Being caring and responsible for others is an important basis of our society.

Absences from school have a large impact on your child's successful learning. In Australia we are privileged for every child to receive an education however every day absent from school will also reduce your child's sense of belonging and success at school. Students need to stay home if they are sick or have appointments. In Australia parents or carers are required by law to explain why your child has not attended school and schools are required to follow up unexplained or unjustified absences. You can expect to receive a phone call from your child's teacher if your child has unexplained absences or a letter from the principal if their numbers of absences are of concern. If no action is taken your case will be referred the Home School Liaison Officer. Thank you to the many parents and carers who promptly ring or send in a note online or with their child.

**2020** Presentation Night/Day on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> of December is allowed to proceed with restrictions. It will be different to our normal event as it includes limited numbers of family members attending on the 4 square metre per person rule in the space and socially distanced seating. We are presently working out how we can make this work within the guidelines and will let you know as soon as we have a workable plan in place.
