work of every teacher and impact every student. School improvement is a continuous process, centred on maximising outcomes for all students, and sustaining this improvement over time. We are all working together towards improvement. All NSW Public Schools are presently developing a new 4 year improvement plan with the combined goal of being the 'best schools in NSW'. I talked to our P&C last night, shared information and discussed their views on what their expectations are for their children in this modern day.

Reading at home! The most important thing you can do is read WITH your children. Sharing reading helps them know it is important and valued. My children used to look forward to us reading a book to them every night and still recall these special family times. We read traditional fairy tales, favourite authors and even the whole Harry Potter series! Their comprehension develops beyond their reading ability and embeds a love of stories forever. You can listen to stories as you travel and talk about the plot, the characters and why the author chose to include aspects into the story. Parents need to lead by example.

Students with Disabilities and Learning Difficulties. At documentation from their GP TPS one of the important areas we focus on is providing support to our students and families. It is the joint develops new or changed symptom responsibility of parents and the school to ensure that these students have the appropriate support and provisions to equitably access education.

The first step in this area is to meet with your child's teacher, supervisor and Principal to discuss the ways we can support your child to have equal access to education. We can then investigate adjustments which can be made, support services and funding which may be available, and implement these processes. We also regularly monitor student progress and make adjustments when needed. We need parents to participate in decisions for your child so they have the opportunity to reach their potential.

If your teacher has contacted you about completing an Individual Education Plan for your child, please call back to arrange a meeting to discuss and sign off on their plan.

**Attendance** Schools continue to follow clear guidelines to maintain our very low presence of COVID-19 in NSW. **Students should be at school unless:** 

- they have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition and the expected timeframe
- they are currently unwell.

In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded **NOT** to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms.

NSW Health has requested that schools encourage anyone who is unwell or has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the <u>COVID-19 clinics</u>.

Students and staff with flu-like symptoms will need to be tested and provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result and be symptom-free before being permitted to return to school.

Students who do not undertake a COVID-19 test will not be permitted to return to school for a 10-day period. Additionally, they must be symptom-free for at least 3 days prior to returning to school.

Students who have seasonal allergic rhinitis or another condition that presents similarly to flu-like symptoms are still required to get tested for COVID-19 and return a negative test result. Where their symptoms continue beyond 10 days, students should provide documentation from their GP confirming their symptoms are typical for their condition. If the student develops new or changed symptoms, they should get tested for COVID-19.

COVID-19 testing for students with complex health or disability may be challenging. In these situations, schools will ask the parent or carer to have their child assessed by their medical practitioner. Where a medical practitioner determines that a COVID-19 test is not required, documentation must be provided to the school to confirm that the student does not have symptoms that warrant a COVID-19 test. The certificate must also indicate that the student is able to return to school.
